

Mt. Ashland is seeking a Manager for the Lift Department to lead a team of lift mechanics, supervisors, and operators. The Lift Department Manager will oversee all operations within the lift department which includes: in-season operations, maintenance, safety and regulatory compliance, staffing, scheduling, performance coaching, discipline, and training. The Lift Department Manager reports directly to the General Manager. This is a year-round position with pay commensurate with experience.

PRIMARY JOB DUTIES:

- Responsible for ensuring guest and staff safety including all safety protocol and procedures (company, state, and federal safety rules/regulations/policies)
- Responsible for training, scheduling and disciplining department staff
- Maintain inventory of parts
- Keep paper and electronic records of all maintenance activities, training and inspections
- Manage budgets and fiscal responsibilities including staffing, equipment and other expenses
- Manage or participate in capital projects
- Operate and maintain lifts according to ANSI B77.1-2017 and manufacturers requirements and recommendations
- Facilitate inspections by US Forest Service and insurance company lift inspectors
- Ensure that lift stations, tools, equipment and shop work areas are kept clean and in good operating condition
- Utilize standard computer programs such as Microsoft Office products, Google platforms such as Gmail, and Google Drive
- Attend weekly management meetings
- Conduct daily staff meetings and weekly safety meetings
- Oversee or conduct all daily, weekly, monthly, and annual inspections and maintenance as required by manufacture or applicable code

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- Must have a strong mechanical aptitude and familiarity with chairlift operations and maintenance including: mechanical, electrical, hydraulic, pneumatic and structural components
- Experience with heavy lifting and rigging
- Welding experience (certified welder certificate preferred)
- Understanding of the NDT process (NDT certification preferred)
- Must be capable of troubleshooting and repairing gas and diesel engines

- Ability to read schematics and blueprints
- Must be willing to work outdoors in all conditions for extended periods of time and must be comfortable working on towers/elevated equipment in harsh conditions.
- Must understand emergency procedures and respond to incidents in a professional manner.
- Must have a passion for skiing/riding and the mountain environment.
