


UPDATES & VISION

Uphill Travel



- Increased Conflicts with Mountain Operations
- Increase in Compliance Incidents
- Raised \$3,000 to be used for avalanche training scholarships, safety programs
- Focus on: 1) beginner touring skiers learning skills, and 2) endurance athletes looking for winter workout
- Separate fee structure for pass holders
- Details by September 1







Rising Costs
